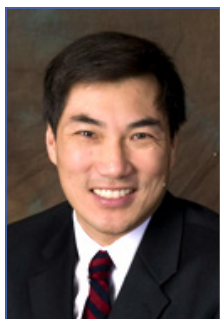

Lee, MD completed medical school at the University of Virginia (Alpha Omega Alpha); ophthalmology residency (chief resident) at Baylor College of Medicine (BCM), and neuro-ophthalmology fellowship at the Johns Hopkins Hospital. He is chair of the Blanton Eye Institute at Houston Methodist Hospital and Professor of Ophthalmology, Neurology, and Neurosurgery (Weill Cornell Medicine); Adjunct Professor; University of Iowa; Baylor College of Medicine and Texas A and M; Clinical Professor at UTMB (Galveston), UT MD Anderson Cancer Center, and University of Buffalo, SUNY.

Dr Lee has served on the Editorial Board of 25 journals including *JAMA Ophthalmology*, *AJO*, *CJO*, *JJO*, *APJO*, *JNO*, *Survey of Ophthalmology*, and *Eye*. He has published over 400 peer-reviewed publications, 40 book chapters, and nine full textbooks; has been the invited speaker at over 400 national and international eye meetings; and has given 13 named lectureships. He has received the AAO honor, senior honor, secretariat, and life honor achievement awards. Dr. Lee has received the resident teaching award seven times at five different academic institutions.

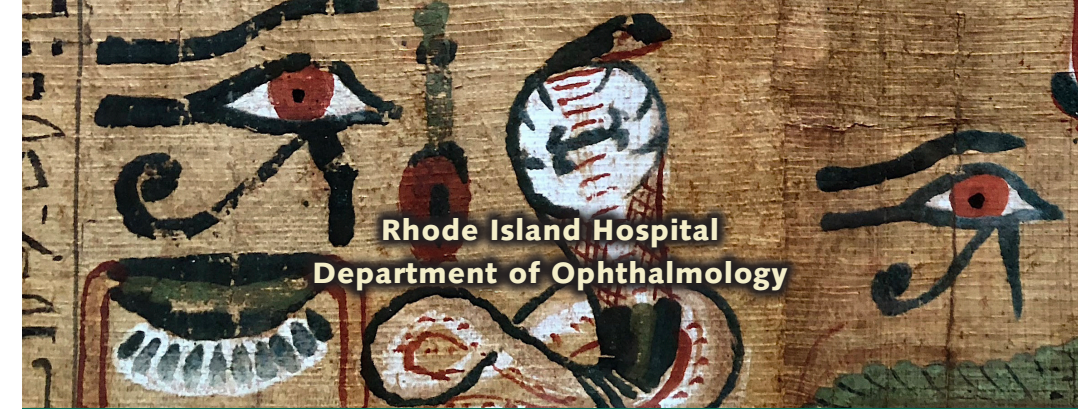

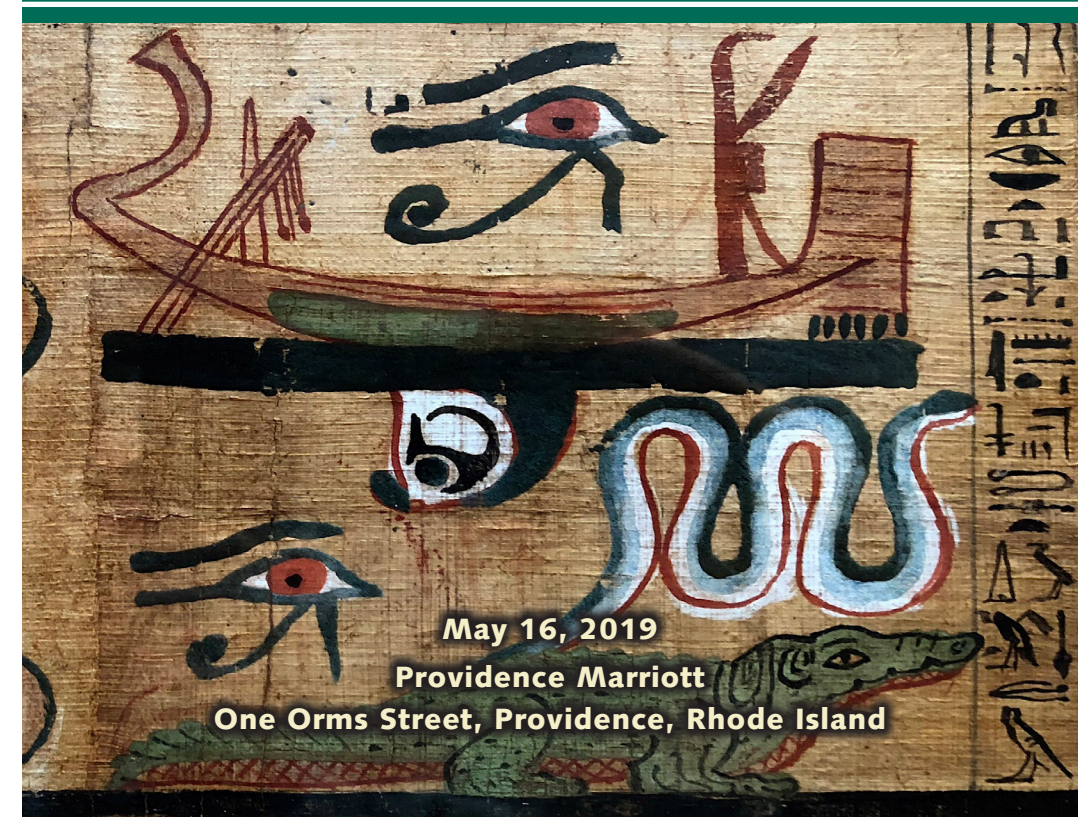
